Sec. 110-135. Stage 2 (aquifer watch) water use restrictions.

(a) The mayor or city manager is authorized to implement stage 2 (aquifer watch) of the city water conservation plan when the aquifer level as measured in the index well is at or below 640 feet above mean sea level. The mayor or city manager is further authorized to terminate stage 2 (aquifer watch) based upon an appropriate change in the water level of the index well. The order to implement and to terminate stage 2 (aquifer watch) shall be made in a public announcement and shall be published a minimum of one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the city.

(b) The order of the mayor or city manager under this section may impose any or all of the following restrictions or conditions on the use of water as the circumstances may require:

- (1) *Landscape irrigation.* Restrictions on landscape irrigation are as follows:
 - a. Existing or new landscapes shall be restricted as follows:
 1. Watering with sprinklers is permitted on any day between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m.
 2. Watering with handheld hoses, buckets or drip irrigation systems is permitted at any time.
 3. Watering with reused water is exempt from reduction measures.
 - b. New landscapes: Planting of new landscapes is prohibited.
- (2) *Vegetable gardens.* Restrictions for vegetable gardens are as follows:
 - a. Watering with sprinklers is permitted on any day between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m.
 - b. Watering with handheld hoses, buckets or drip irrigation systems is permitted at any time.
- (3) *Golf courses.* Irrigation of tees and greens on golf courses is permitted with the following restrictions:
 - a. Watering with sprinklers is permitted on any day between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m.
 - b. Irrigation with reused water is exempt from reduction measures.
- (4) *Swimming pools, hot tubs and similar facilities.* Restrictions for swimming pools, hot tubs and similar facilities are as follows:
 - a. Filling and makeup of existing facilities are permitted.
 - b. Filling and makeup for new facilities are prohibited.
 - c. Drainage onto impervious surfaces is prohibited.

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- (5) *Aesthetic uses.* Inside or outside use for aesthetic purposes is prohibited except with reused water.
 - (6) *Other outdoor uses.* Restrictions for other outdoor uses are as follows:
 - a. Waste is prohibited.
 - b. The washing of any impervious surface is prohibited, except for immediate human health, safety and welfare.
 - c. Noncommercial washing of automobiles, trucks, trailers, boats, airplanes and other mobile equipment is permitted. Washing shall be done with a handheld hose or bucket. Handheld hoses shall be equipped with a positive shutoff nozzle.
 - (7) *Commercial and industrial uses.* Restrictions on commercial and industrial uses are as follows:
 - a. Washing of automobiles, trucks, trailers, boats, airplanes and other mobile equipment is permitted on the immediate premises of a commercial washing facility.
 - b. Commercial nurseries, commercial sod farms and other similar establishments shall restrict watering hours to 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
 - c. Restaurants are prohibited from serving water to customers unless specifically requested by the customer.
 - d. Voluntary reduction of water use in commercial and industrial processes is recommended.
 - e. Demand reduction measures for all outdoor water uses apply to commercial and industrial uses.
 - (8) *Domestic use.* Voluntary reduction for indoor domestic use is recommended by any means available.
 - (9) *Essential and utility uses.* Restrictions on essential and utility uses are as follows:
 - a. Firefighting: No restrictions (includes the exercising of relief valves on fire trucks).
 - b. Medical use by health care facilities: No restrictions.
 - c. Water utility use shall be restricted as follows:
 - 1. Reduction of average system pressure to 60 psi is recommended.
 - 2. Leak detection and system repairs are recommended.
 - 3. Stabilizing and equalizing system pressure are recommended.
 - 4. Sewer line flushing is prohibited except for emergencies.
 - 5. Fire hydrant flushing is not prohibited.
 - 6. Power production use: Reduction of water use is recommended.
