Citizen Complaint Process

It is the goal of the Luling Police Department to provide quality and unbiased police service to the entire community. While constantly striving to attain that goal, it is understood that from time to time persons having contact with the Police Department may find the need to lodge a complaint – whether formally or informally against an individual officer, or the Police Department in general. This memorandum sets forth the process for lodging a complaint with the Department.

Informal complaints may be made by phone, by letter, e-mail or in person. In order to file a complaint you may contact the Police Supervisor on duty or by appointment address your concerns to the Chief of Police directly. The address and telephone number for making complaints is:

Formal complaints against Police Officers are accepted only in writing and sworn to by the person making the complaint. You may make an appointment with the Chief of Police to arrange and complete the process. Just as persons who are arrested must be notified of the charges against them, Police Officers must also be notified and provided a copy of the complaint prior to any potential employment action. Please pay careful attention to the following provisions:

- **The Department does not accept complaints later than 90 days from the date of the incident related to the complaint**, with the exception to very special cases such as criminal misconduct, or when good cause can be shown making the complaint sooner was not possible or practical. Complaints must be made by a person who “has standing”. In other words, the actual recipient of police misconduct, a person who witnesses an unlawful act by a Police Officer, or parents/legal guardians making complaints on behalf of minors.
- A person who wishes to file a complaint involving violations of civil rights may also choose to make his/her complain with the U. S. Department of Justice by contacting your local F.B.I. (Federal Bureau of Investigation) office.
- The Police Department **does not accept complaints in regard to the guilt or innocence of defendants in traffic ticket cases and/or criminal offenses**. Those matters are reserved to the judgment of the proper judicial court for adjudication.
